- It is unlawful to park on city streets between 2am - 6am.
- Garage sales are permitted 3 times per year for no longer than 3 days each. Posting of signs is only allowed on property having sale. No permit needed.
- Grass & weeds must be mowed to less than 12".
- Open burning is not allowed in the city limits.
- Curfew for youth 14 & under is 10pm and for ages 15-17, midnight.

The Value of Water

Everyone knows the essential role that water plays in daily life for things like cooking, cleaning, fighting fires, electric generation and irrigating crops. The fact that the adult human body is made up of roughly 70% water, makes water a basic need for all of us. The value of water to a community is inarguable – clean, safe, reliable water supply is essential.

So, what is the price for such a valuable resource? Here in Coldwater the cost for 1,000 gallons of water is \$1.82 or 0.182¢ per gallon. How does that cost compare to other items we buy on a daily basis?

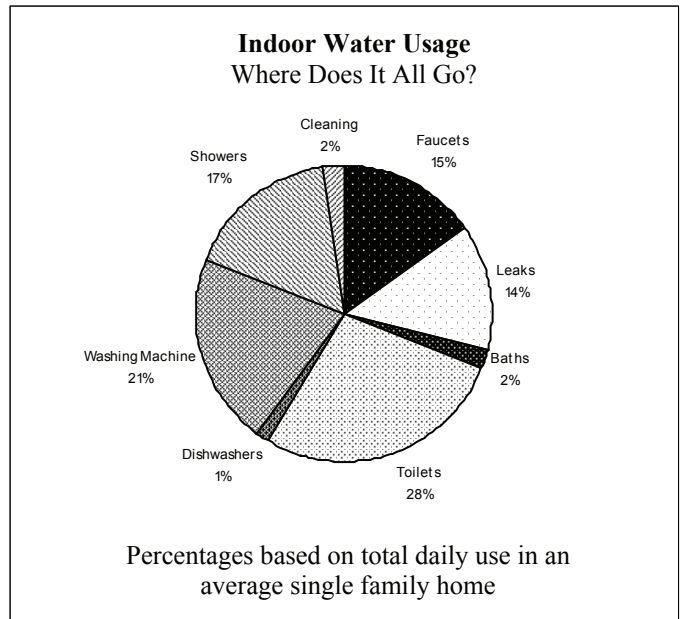
Here is the cost for 1,000 gallons of other “essentials” purchased on a regular basis:

- ◆ Gas - \$3,950
- ◆ Milk - \$3,640
- ◆ Beer - \$6,876

- ◆ Fitness Water - \$3,794
- ◆ Diet Soda - \$2,947
- ◆ Bottled Water - \$1,333

City water service is a true value!

Are your Electronics Really Protected?

We’ve all heard the saying “you get what you pay for”, so when it comes to protecting your high dollar electronics, why get frugal on the surge protector?

To better understand surges, let’s explain what a surge is and why electronics should be protected from them.

In normal household wiring, the standard voltage is 120 volts. If the voltage rises above 120 voltage, there is a problem and a surge protector prevents that problem from harming your electronics.

What does a surge protector do?

A standard surge protector passes the electrical current along from the outlet to a number of electrical and electronic devices plugged into the power strip. If the voltage from the outlet surges, (rises above the accepted level), the surge protector diverts the extra electricity into the outlet's grounding wire. If the surge is high enough, it can however cause significant damage to your electronics, protected or not.

Here are some tips to follow when you’re looking for surge protection:

- Look for the UL (Underwriters Laboratories) ratings.
- Make sure you’re not buying just a power outlet strip.
- If it’s under \$10.00, it’s probably not going to protect much.

Whole-house surge protection is your best protection. The BPU has it available for just \$5.99 a month!
